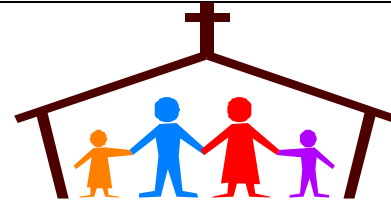

## THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

## BAPTISMAL PREPARATION

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

## SACRAMENTAL SPONSORSHIP CERTIFICATE

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish

## THE SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Our parish family extends its congratulations as you prepare for your upcoming wedding. Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301. **Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance.** At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

**FEDERAL DONOR RECORDKEEPING RULE ON CHARITABLE DEDUCTION**

The Pension Protection Act of 2006 included a section relative to charitable deductions.

The rules require that people claiming charitable deduction back up those deduction claims with cancelled checks; records from banks or credit card companies; or written notices from the charity or not-for-profit institution. The burden is on the donor to maintain or obtain the required records.

The parish will provide a record of contributions, upon request, which will satisfy the IRS requirements. Contributions of cash can only be used as a deduction if church envelopes are used enabling the parish to identify the donor. Please call Deneen Thomas at 609-267-0209 ext. 303

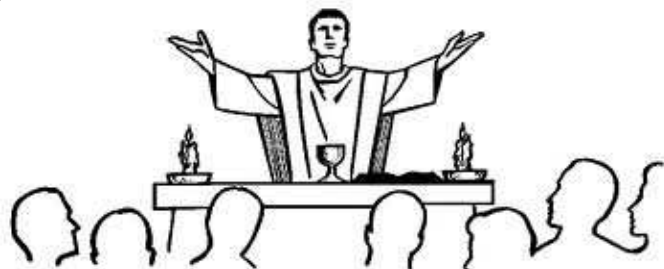

***The Roman Missal, Third Edition***

The People's Parts at Mass

Many have asked, "Why a new *Roman Missal* now?" Well, first of all, the Eucharist is the source and summit of Christian life. We have forty years of experience in celebrating the Liturgy in the vernacular. The revised text builds on that experience and offers a liturgical language marked by greater formality and dignity. The revised text draws more deeply on the rich Catholic theological Tradition, including Scripture and the works of the Fathers of the Church.

We, therefore, need to reflect on what we can gain from our participation in the implementation of this new translation – as well as on what we fear we might be losing.

The new translation uses words filled with theological meaning. But these words may be unfamiliar to many of us and require explanation. We realize that some of us may be uneasy about replacing texts long ago committed to memory and some may feel anxiety over having to learn new responses. So the parish will offer classes in November and December to provide instruction about the changes in the people's parts of the Mass. (Please check the Sunday bulletins for the dates, times and locations of these classes.)

By coming together as a parish community, with open minds and hearts, we will experience anew the importance of communion and of being one with the Church. We will come to recognize and renew our baptismal call in full, conscious and active participation in the Liturgy. Hopefully, this will lead to a deepening of our understanding and appreciation of the Liturgy, nurture liturgical practices that will lead to fuller liturgical participation, and help us to celebrate the Liturgy with renewed purpose.

As the Fathers of Vatican II explained, "Liturgical services are not private functions,

but are celebrations belonging to the Church, which is the 'sacrament of unity,' namely, the holy people united and ordered under their bishops. [Such] services have to do with the whole Body of the Church; they manifest it and have effects upon it" (*Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy* 26).

In our classes we will review in detail the revised wording of the new *Missal*, but the closer connection to the original Latin wording will be immediately evident. For example, the ancient greeting *Dominus vobiscum* (The Lord be with you) brought the response *Et cum spiritu tuo* (And with your spirit). When that greeting was put into the English vernacular, using equivalent translation, the response became *And also with you*. That is not what the Latin means. There is nothing inherently wrong with responding as we now do – And also with you – but the Latin provides a deeper, more liturgical sense to that response.

So, too, in the *Confiteor* (the prayer that begins *I confess*): we now say that we have "sinned through my own fault" and thus summarize a large part of the original Latin prayer. The new translation returns to a more literal application of the Latin and says that "I have *greatly* sinned, . . . *through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault.*" It ends in substantially the same way as we presently end it. Here, again, we can see the richness of the original Latin text.
